We are grateful to staff and parents for their support, and we look forward to positive results.

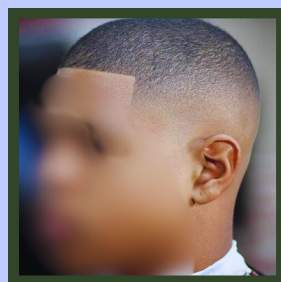


Secure Your Child's Future Today

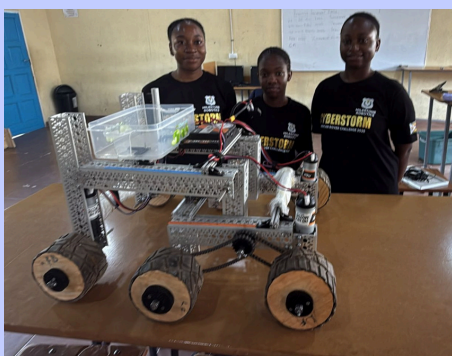

Three Milestone College students, **Ashley Mapanzure**, **Tavonga Musariri**, and **Nokutenda Ndemera**, were crowned **National Champions in Robotics and Artificial Intelligence** with their award-winning Mars-ready rover project. Their innovation impressed judges with creativity, engineering excellence, and scientific potential.

As a result, the team has been selected to represent Zimbabwe at the **Taiwan International Science Fair** on **29 January 2026**, joining young innovators worldwide. Their achievement is a proud moment for the school community and a testament to the strength of our robotics and AI programs.

Milestone College teams excelled at the recent competitions hosted by Princeton Institute:

- **Public Speaking:**

- Senior relay team (Atidaishe Moyo, Ashley Chibobo, Mandipaishe Musendo) took 1st place.
- Junior relay team (Tadiwanashe Chikwekwe, Cheryl Mangwiro) secured 2nd place.
- In prepared speeches, Tiana Chidawanyika won 1st place with 62 points, followed by Samantha Mukunyadze in 2nd place.

- **Spelling Bee:**

- O'Neil placed 2nd, narrowly missing the top spot.
- In Form 2, Nokutenda Chinhema (29/30) and Precious Chisango (28/30) claimed 1st and 2nd place.
- Tierney Timire, a national champion, dominated the Form 3 category.
- The team is now preparing for regional competitions in Botswana this December.

- **Debate:**

- Despite technical challenges, Milestone's Opening Opposition team (Tashinga Chingono & Kudakwashe Paunganwa) emerged winners.
- Other panelists included Makomborero Kundiona and Tinaye Togara.
